### MISSOULA CHILD CARE ADVANTAGE

Construction was in full swing at the former Cold Springs school where we renovated classrooms into six fully-functioning child care businesses. We celebrated a groundbreaking in October and the businesses opened in early 2024. MCCA focuses on creating new child care slots, providing shared-services for child care owners, and stabilizing the child care sector.

In 2023, our **Back-To-School Backpack Program**, provided
1,263 local students with brandnew backpacks filled with school supplies. By removing this worry for families, we can help set students up for success.

#### Missoula Substance Use Disorder

**Connect** launched the *Recovery* Friendly Workplace initiative this year. RFW promotes individual wellness by creating work environments that further the mental and physical wellbeing of employees. Eight nonprofit organizations joined as early adopters and were certified as RFWs.





### **PROJECT TOMORROW MONTANA**

In 2023, PTMT, in collaboration with Missoula Public Health, created a Survivors of Suicide Handbook that has been distributed to first responders and community partners. Additionally, monthly and bi-annual suicide prevention trainings were held with partner organizations.

# **Financial** Stability

### **REACHING HOME**

Financial stability is impossible without a roof over one's head. United Way remains at the forefront of efforts to end homelessness, leading the way with expanded initiatives that emphasize deep collaboration and trusting partnerships with the public and private sectors. Our commitment ensures a more comprehensive and cohesive approach to addressing houselessness in Missoula County.

### **TEMPORARY SAFE OUTDOOR SPACE**

On January 10, 2023, the new TSOS location welcomed residents to the 30 hard-sided shelters. 101 residents called the TSOS home, with 65 achieving housing and 8 entering long-term treatment — a 73% success rate. The TSOS remains a crucial resource for Missoula's unhoused, supported by United Way as the primary private-sector funder and logistician. Despite this success, more than 240 people are on the TSOS waitlist.

The Housing Solutions Fund is United Way's tool that provides flexible solutions to the varied needs of Missoula residents on the brink of homelessness. In 2023, 80% of funds focused on prevention-based efforts - working to keep Missoulians housed; rental assistance was the most common use of funds.

Wildfire Ready Missoula focused on reducing wildfire risk and catastrophic losses to resources and property on private land. In 2023, 35 homeowners treated 52 acres for fuel reduction. Additionally, 115 fire-risk assessments were performed. Our goal is to make this proactive work accessible to more income-diverse households.
