MISSOULA, Mont. — On Wednesday, August 20, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., United Way of Missoula County and Missoula Chevrolet will once again partner to give local students the tools they need to start the school year strong—distributing nearly 1,000 brand-new backpacks filled with essential school supplies to children in Missoula and Mineral counties.

The Back to School Backpack Pickup Event, held at 3663 N Reserve St, ensures that elementary, middle, and high school students across the region begin the school year with the tools they need to thrive. Backpacks will be distributed through school districts, local nonprofits, and community partners, reaching kids who might otherwise go without the supplies they need.
